SEPTEMBER 22ND MEMBERSHIP MEETING MINUTES

TREASURER'S REPORT

Gary gave the report- including membership, donation, and apparel income of \$8,553.85. Expenses included AWSC renewal, advertising, storage unit costs for \$3,468.

MOTION

John moved to approve the treasurer's report, Alex seconded. All in favor, approved.

MEMBERSHIP REPORT

Carlie gave the membership report- to date for 2025 we have 166 members, which is comparable to 2024's 186 at this time. We currently have 7 associates (4 2024), 8 new members (6 2024), 151 renewals (158 2024), and 0 landowner members (18 2024). Landowner members will increase as Joyce and Carlie renew them.

SPONSOR REPORT

Joyce reported 20 commercial sponsors, 8 of which are new this year.

TLBRT

Scott thanks everyone (about 65 people) who came out for trail cleaning in October. Big thanks to Kip and the Zent Family Foundation for donating the money needed to replace the well-loved groomer tracks this year. Trail updates include the re-opening of the Sugar Camp to Three Lakes trail, as well as progress on Trail 13 to Eagle River.

AWSC FALL WORKSHOP REPORT

Sue, Scott, and Kerry attended the workshop. Kerry found it quite impressive! Wisconsin boasts over 600 snowmobile clubs (compared to Minnesota's 200), with over 41,000 members of clubs in the state. Sue attended sessions on social media presence as well as KAOS and learned a ton! Scott addressed registration and trail pass cost increases- Wisconsin has a \$9 million budget, and has seen an increase of funding requests to the tune of just over 12.5 million in recent years. Trail passes have only been required since 2014, and has always been \$10 for club members. We are still the cheapest midwest state for trail passes and registration. Scott thanks the NLSC for basket donation for the silent auction which raised over \$5,000! Sue secured Miss Snowflake to draw the winning GTR ticket in March.

IMPORTANT UPDATES

Proposals to increase trail passes were discussed at the workshop: \$10-\$20 for snowmobile club members, \$30-\$50 for non-club members, and \$50-\$70 for out of state residents. Registration may increase by about \$20.

GUEST SPEAKER - JACKIE HILDEBRANDT - WOMEN ON SNOW

Women on Snow celebrating their 40th anniversary year! In 1978, 3 women chose to ride from Eagle River to St. Germain without their husbands, and had such a blast doing so that they decided to make it a tradition in 1986! They decided to do it for 5 years and retire from the event. In 1991 they did not ride, and came right back in 1992 to do it anyway. The event boasts an average of 100-120 women each year, and has had as many as 140 women included on the three-day, six group ride. The weekend includes all-day rides on Friday and Saturday, including a banquet on Saturday evening where first year riders graduate from their signature Pink hat to a black hat, making them a veteran. Women have been returning year after year (the longest streak being 39 years!), and have seen generations of Women on Snow. The organization also plans tour rides with longer distances and time, and always generously donates to each club whose trails they travel. Jackie was and is a wealth of information, and encourages women to register (October 15-December 15th) to join this year's ride. Thank you, Jackie!!!
